From the Superintendent's Desk

Winter Weather Will Be Here Before We Know It

I wanted to take a few minutes as we approach the winter weather season to talk about inclement weather, how it affects schools, and how decisions regarding delays, cancellations, and early-outs are made.

In Iowa, we see an entire range of weather in any given year. Fog, Ice, Snow, Sleet, all can and do play havoc with driving conditions throughout the school year. As a school district we always evaluate current weather conditions, weather forecasts, and actual road conditions when considering any sort of delay, cancellation, or early-out.

With every weather related decision, safety is our biggest concern—for buses, parents driving, and student drivers. We feel a great sense of responsibility in determining whether road conditions are safe for travel and ask that parents and students pay special attention to our local media outlets, our web site (www.ballard.k12.ia.us), or the State's school alert system when winter weather threatens.

It is extremely important that each family, especially those with elementary students, have a plan in place in the event of a delay, cancellation, or early-out. Please go over this plan with your student(s) so that they know what to do if weather forces a change in school attendance.

As a district, we try to make delay and cancellation decisions as early as possible in the morning so that parents and staff can begin to plan their day. Periodically, weather conditions change so rapidly that it is impossible to make a weather related decision as early as we would like, but know that we will always make decisions with safety in mind.

The Clothes Pantry "Wishing Tree Project" will begin the 2010 Holiday Season of Giving on **Sunday, November 21 and continue through Sunday December 5.** Residents living in the Ballard School District are eligible to request assistance with buying gifts for their children. Community members should come in during open hours and fill out a "Wish List" and put it on the tree.

Pantry hours are: Sundays 1 -3 P.M., Wednesdays 4 – 6, P.M. and Saturdays 10 – 12 A.M.

Community members wanting to fulfill these wishes should also come in during these days and take a "list" home to purchase some of the items requested.

Gifts purchased need to be **returned to the pantry by Saturday December 11.** It is up to the individual whether or not to wrap the gifts. It is recommended to put gifts in a large bag along with wrapping paper and tape as well as the list/glove they selected. Parents then could wrap the gifts themselves.

Gifts may be picked up by families at the pantry on December 12 , 15, or 18 during open hours, unless other arrangements have been made.

Danelle Jensen reported on the recent Homecoming Meal fundraiser which was successful with the aid of 5 high school students who helped serve: Taylor Charter, MaKayla Markley, Donovan Cameron, Tiffany Patterson and Chelsie Hoover. Thank you's also were sent to Burke for the discount on the meat, Sara Lee for the gift of the buns and the Ballard Honor Society for their gift of \$135. Danelle reported that \$1000 was raised for our cause. The committee thanked Danelle for her time and effort on this successful project.

Valerie Allen presented the treasurers report, no additions or changes were suggested. She reported there are still thirteen 2009 grads who need to collect their scholarship money.

DeAnn Thompson of Edward Jones Investment presented her annual report on the endowment investments, specifically to orient the committee toward the need to increase the endowment amount to provide adequate funds for the increase in the base scholarship. The committee thanked her for her clear information and her valuable expertise in managing these funds.

In old business, the committee voted to raise the amount of the endowment donations to \$7000, in January, 2011, as had been discussed since the base scholarship was raised to \$350. Letters to scholarship supporters will be going out by December 1.

Also as part of old business, Brenda Brink reported on the sponsors obtained so far for the Points for Scholars fundraiser.
